GSSA PRESIDENT

November was a busy month for the Society with the African Exploration Showcase on 6-7 and the Fellows Dinner on November 11th. Ahead of these regular year end meetings, the Northern Cape Branch held their Annual Northern Cape Commodity Day event and associated excursion at Kathu on November 1st and 2nd, and a group from the KZN Branch held an informal meeting at UKZN on November 4th to discuss the renewal of the Branch from January 2025. An interim committee under the guidance of Past-President Avinash Bisnath has been established to take this important initiative forward.

Manco met on November 1st and will meet again on November 26th ahead of the Council Meeting on November 28th.

The Northern Cape Commodity Day was the last event involving Loni Gallant as Chair of the NC Branch and of the wider branch executive committee. Loni has been directly involved with the NC Branch since 2019 and served as Chair from 2022–2024. The Society recognizes that Loni's energy and leadership underpinned the success of the NC Branch, and I take this opportunity to thank her for her contributions to the Branch, and by extension the Society, over the years. The incoming Chair of the NC Branch is Palesa Boikanyo from South 32.

The 2024 African Exploration Showcase took place at the Emperors Palace Convention Centre. Despite some initial challenges adjusting to the new venue, the event went well and the organizing committee of Natalie Brand, Tshego Majane and Camille Kraak, has received lots of positive feedback. The two-day programme attracted 125 registrants and featured 25 project presentations from across Africa's mining and exploration sectors. Shorter presentations were made by the annual sponsors of the event.

The Fellows Dinner was held at the Woodmead Campus of the JCC on November 11th and a total of 82 Fellows and guests were present. In keeping with tradition, the 2024 group of Fellows was inducted into the Society (13 in total) and the Senior Awards of the Society were presented. Lew Ashwal (Wits) was presented with the Draper Memorial Medal for his contributions to South African Earth Science. The Des Pretorius Memorial Award went to Rais Latypov (Wits) and was accepted on his behalf by Grant Bybee and the Jubilee Medal was awarded to a team from University of Jena in Germany led by Andreas Zametzer for their paper Tectonic and sedimentary evolution of a potential supra-detachment fault basin, Archaean Moodies Group (~3.22 Ga), central Barberton Greenstone Belt. SAJG volume 126. Unfortunately, none of the authors could be present at the Fellows Dinner but Christoph Heubeck, who supervised the project, has confirmed that the Jubilee Medals have arrived in Jena.

The guest speaker was Keith Scott, CEO of the Mining Oil and Gas Services Group and of Fraser Alexander, the largest subsidiary in that group. Keith's presentation was entitled "Challenges and Opportunities in the Energy Transition". His insightful and informative talk focussed on "The Just Energy Transition" and highlighted many aspects of this important field including the negative impacts of mining related to the transition, on African countries with cobalt ore deposits. Keith also highlighted the dominant role played by China in the renewable energy space who, in his words, "have already won the race."

This is the last Newsletter of the year, and I would like to take this opportunity to thank every GSSA member for their continued support throughout 2024 be it by timeous payment of fees or registration at our various meetings.

The GSSA is a voluntary association, and our continued success is directly linked to the members of the various committees and editorial teams who volunteer their time and expertise and to the hard-working office staff of Craig, Lully, Marliese, Sally and Kate. Thank you all for going the extra mile or more than one occasion.


Public Consultation of the SAMOG Code Review and Approval





Witwatersrand Fieldtrip






