Let me start this newsletter with the hope that 2025 will be a peaceful and prosperous year for all GSSA Members, Fellows and their families.

2025 is the 130th Anniversary of the Society and this achievement has been identified as a theme of Geocongress 2025 to be held in Bloemfontein in June. The LOC for Geocongress has proposed a total of 22 sessions with abstract submission for papers linked to these sessions closing on March 31st. Society activities for 2025 begin with the relaunch of the KZN Branch on January 30th with an AGM at STEC on the Westville Campus of UKZN. In addition to the business meeting, there will be a talk by Kevin le Bron entitled Rock Engineering Applications in the Mining Industry.

On Saturday February 1st the Fellows Committee host a lunch for GSSA Fellows resident in the Western Cape. The event, which has been championed by Louise Coney the current Chair of the Fellows Committee, will take the form of a lunch at Beyerskloof Wine Estate, near Stellenbosch. The main event of Quarter 1 the Namaqualand Diamond Centenary conference and fieldtrip between March 11–20. The conference will be held at Letatsi Lodge in Vanrhynsdorp, and late registration closes on February 28th. Full details are available under the events tab on the GSSA website. Join the Geological Society of South Africa (GSSA) and the Northern Cape Branch (NCB) in celebrating 100 years since the initial discovery of diamonds in Namaqualand by Jack Carstens on the Port Nolloth Reserve (1925), followed by the rich deposits at Alexander Bay by Hans Merensky in 1926. The event is being championed by Tania Marshall.

The Fellows Committee has called for submissions for the 2025 GSSA Awards and I take this opportunity to remind the Heads of Academic Departments/Schools to identify submissions for the various student awards.

SAMCODES SNIPPETS

Inclusive vs Exclusive Reporting

The debate regarding whether Mineral Resources should be reported inclusive or exclusive of Mineral Reserves has been ongoing for years, and circa 2012 it was classified as a 'parked issue' by the SAMREC Working Group as no consensus was reached. (Rupprecht, 2020).

Clause 42 of the SAMREC Code notes that "In situations in which both Mineral Resources and Mineral Reserves are reported, the Public Report must include a statement that clearly indicates whether the Mineral Resources are inclusive of, or additional to, those Mineral Resources that have been modified to produce Mineral Reserves."



DRILLING SKILLS FOR GEOLOGISTS CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

About this certificate program

The aim of this certificate is to improve the candidate's understanding of the fundamental processes that are involved in drilling boreholes and therefore to improve the candidate's effectiveness in identifying the source of problems and managing a drilling project.

The program also examines fundamental aspects of the use and application of drilling fluids and the principles of borehole surveying. A course on economic aspects focusses on the major cost drivers and the structure of drilling contracts.
