GSSA PRESIDENT

The month started with a lunch for GSSA Fellows resident in the Western Cape at Beyerskloof Wine Estate near Stellenbosch. The event, which was attended by 35 Fellows, was organized by Louise Coney and Annegret Lombard from the Fellows Committee and included a talk from Hielke Jelsma (Anglo American). Despite the very bright lighting at the venue, impacting on the presentation, the response from the attendees was overwhelming positive, and a similar event is being discussed for 2026. The event at Beyerskloof represented the first "Fellows Dinner" type function outside of Gauteng and the Western Cape was selected based on the fact is has, by far, the highest number of Fellows after Gauteng. Registration for the Namaqualand Diamond Centenary conference to be held at Letatsi Lodge in Vanrhynsdorp starting on March 11th, stands at 57, including, thanks to the generosity of our sponsors (event and annual), 8 full-time students. The conference which includes over 20 formal talks and a poster session by delegates from industry, academia and the CGS is being championed by Tania Marshall. Late registration for the conference closes on February 28th.


The number of applications received for financial support from the GSSA Research, Education, and Investment (REI) Fund has increased steadily over the last few years and applications in 2025 continue this trend. A total of 25 applications have been received with the majority from staff and post-graduate students at South African Universities (10 institutions in total). As in previous years, the applications are for funds to offset research expenses and for conferences.

The REI committee, chaired by Reinie Meyer, will evaluate the applications over the next few weeks after which the recommendations made will be sent to the GSSA Management Committee (Manco, 25th March) and then Council (29th March), for ratification and approval.

The call for nominations for the GSSA Student Awards was published in the January Newsletter and is still open. The responsibility for adjudicating the submissions lies with the Fellows Committee of the GSSA. As in previous years it is hoped to announce the names of the awardees at the AGM which this year is on July 17th. To achieve this target the Fellows Committee requires digital copies of the final dissertation/thesis, together with a short motivation from supervisors/advisors, by April 1st, 2025. 25 years of the SAMREC Code

March 2025 marks the 25th anniversary of the South African Code for the Reporting of Exploration Results, Mineral Resources, and Mineral Reserves, commonly known as the SAMREC Code. This milestone is a testament to the enduring significance of the SAMREC Code in the global minerals industry, reflecting its pivotal role in standardizing and enhancing the transparency of mineral reporting.

The SAMREC Code was launched on 24 March 2000, following extensive collaboration among industry stakeholders, including the Geological Society of South Africa (GSSA) and the Southern African Institute of Mining and Metallurgy (SAIMM).





About this certificate program

The aim of this certificate is to improve the candidate's understanding of the fundamental processes that are involved in drilling boreholes and therefore to improve the candidate's effectiveness in identifying the source of problems and managing a drilling project.

The program also examines fundamental aspects of the use and application of drilling fluids and the principles of borehole surveying. A course on economic aspects focusses on the major cost drivers and the structure of drilling contracts.
